



West O'ahu/Farrington Highway Guideway Contract

Kiewit Field Work Roadwork and Traffic Update Week of July 24, 2011

Traffic Impacts:

- Crews will be working along Farrington Highway between Ala Ike Street and Kualakai Parkway (North-South Road). Work will consist of:
 - Shaft work on the shoulder of Kamehameha Highway between Ala Ike Street and Acacia Road.
- Crews will be working along the H-1 Waipahu on- and off-ramps between Farrington Highway and Kamehameha Highway on the shoulder installing silt fence, constructing access and drilling for soil samples.
- Crews will be working along the median of Farrington Highway between Mokuola Street and Paiwa Street trimming and relocating trees.

Farrington Highway, H-1 and City Streets Traffic Plan:

- Work will require lane closures during the day from 8:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. with shoulder and median work signage/cones along the side of the road to mark the work area.
- One lane of traffic in each direction along Farrington Highway will remain open.

Upcoming Traffic Impacts:

- Starting August 5 - 15, 2011 Farrington Hwy. detour to Old Fort Weaver Road Loop will be from 8:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. on the weekdays, Monday - Friday. The detour will route traffic onto Old Fort Weaver Road from both directions, passing through a stop-controlled intersection. Appropriate signs will be displayed to notify motorists in advance and an off-duty police officer will be at the intersection during peak hours.

Summary:

Kiewit Infrastructure West Co., awarded the contract for the first 6.5-miles of the Honolulu Rail Transit Project, is continuing to prepare for construction with work along the project route from East Kapolei to Pearl City. The City and County of Honolulu issued a notice to proceed to Kiewit for the relocation of utilities, design and pre-engineering activities in East Kapolei and along Farrington Highway in Waipahu. During this work, crews will be working on Kamehameha Highway and Farrington Highway between Acacia Road and Kualakai Parkway (North-South Road) along the median and shoulder lanes. Kiewit continues safety, public information and environmental training for all Kiewit staff, craft, subcontractors and consultants related to the project. Kiewit and the City continue with community relations efforts by keeping the public informed of lane closures and possible impacts.
